TURF TALK by Mike Stupica, Golf Course Superintendent

“Game on” or so we used to say. Summer is here and it is time for the real work to begin. 10 tons of fertilizer went out just in time for the rain last Thursday and boy did it work. The fairways are growing like crazy and the rough is filling in nicely. The Member-Guest tournament was filled with good comments from all the participants and quite honestly I don’t think the course can be in any better shape for this time of year. If you haven’t made it out to the course in the past couple of weeks it has sure changed for the better. We are nearing the end of the transition period on our turf and the major growing season is here. The actively growing turf gives us the opportunity to get a little more aggressive with our management practices. We will start a summer fertility program on the greens as well as cultivate them when necessary. The fairways are beginning to take shape and the growth regulator will be applied, so very soon the perfect lies in the fairways will replace unhealed divots and thin areas which mother-nature claimed over the winter. The bunker drains which were installed over the winter are doing an excellent job. Combine that with new machinery to maintain them and the bunkers are in the best shape we have seen here in quite some time. The advances in course

Maintenance equipment have allowed us to complete our day to day tasks much more efficiently thus giving us more time to get other tasks complete. Bottom line is this season will be our best yet. I am very excited for the outlook on this growing season.

The next tournament for us will be the MGA’s Father/Son. This tournament gives us the opportunity to show off our course to several hundred golfers from all over the state. I am proud of the fact that this course is the one everyone is really here to play. Although the tournament is held at two other fine courses in the area, we seem to get the most attention from the participants. This, I think, is due to the great lay out of the course along with the excellent conditions we provide for our members. Combine the course with the new additions and renovations to the club house area and we are definitely the best place to play in the Jackson area. Turf Tip: Water is the key to a beautiful lawn but how much is enough? I recommend watering your lawn only when needed. When you start to see dry spots in your lawn take the hose and water those spots by hand and then use your irrigation system to water the entire yard early the next morning. Two or three times per week should be just fine.

Strategy Tip

Tennis has two basic objectives: Hit the ball over the net and hit it inside some lines. When you hit the ball over the net, realize that you have accomplished 50% of your goals! This simple point will help anyone play better tennis in seconds. It is especially true about serving and returning serve. From a serving perspective, one of the worst things you can do is hit your first serve in the net and then hit your second serve in the net as well. You didn’t even give gravity a chance! From a receiving perspective, don’t think you always have to hit great returns to win tennis matches. Just get the ball back consistently, and you always have a chance that your opponent will make an error.
